<u>Geometry – Properties of shapes</u> (2D/3D)

Pupils will continue to learn the following content through a range of practical and mental approaches.

- ✓ Identify and draw 2-D shapes and make 3-D shapes using modelling materials; recognise 3-D shapes in different orientations and describe them.
- Recognise angles as a property of shape or a description of a turn.
- ✓ Identify right angles, recognise that two right angles make a half-turn, three make three quarters of a turn and four a complete turn; identify whether angles are greater than or less than a right angle.
- ✓ Identify horizontal and vertical lines and pairs of perpendicular and parallel lines.
